“My IHRA highlight was the presentation of the survey 'A Matter of Comparison' at the Plenary in Iasi in November 2016. It was the conclusion of an important research project to collate an overview of programs provided by 120 organizations worldwide in the fields of education, remembrance and research, which deal with the Holocaust in comparison to other mass atrocities. The survey is the first of its kind and will provide our Committee with a solid basis for its ongoing work. The addition of a specific question on this topic in the IHRA country reports will also ensure that the IHRA as a whole keeps this topic on its radar.”
