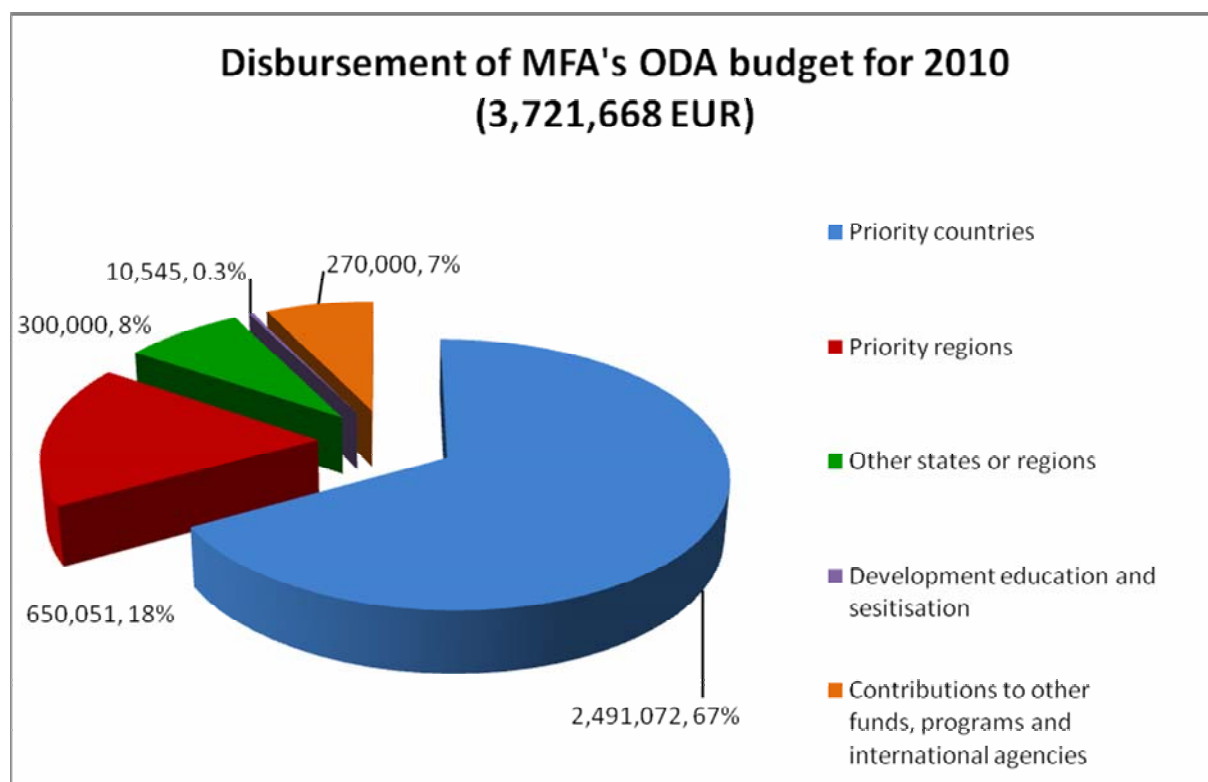


Disbursement of MFA's ODA budget for 2010 (3,721,668 EUR)

In 2010, the MFA's ODA budget amounted to about 3,721,668 EUR, this being allocated through multilateral channels as well as through bilateral channels.

The geographical breakdown of the ODA budget for 2010 was done according to the figure below:



In detail, the MFA's ODA budget was used for:

I. Contributions to the benefit of priority countries

Republic of Moldova: 1,991,072 EUR

- Implementation program of the sanitary-veterinary legislation in the field of hygiene and animal origin products – 300,000 EUR;
- Assistance of the consolidation of the Informational Marketing Centre (IMC) at the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Industry in the Republic of Moldova – 150,000 EUR;
- Professional training program for diplomats and public servants – 67,000 EUR;
- The recovery of the headquarters in which the Cahul Regional Blood Transfusion Centre is to function – 140,000 EUR;

- The development of Chişinău municipality, implemented by UNDP Moldova: implementing an electronic management system in order to improve the services rendered to the citizens of Chişinău – 200,000 EUR;
- Projects aiming at consolidating measures of trust between Chişinău and Tiraspol in the fields of education and civil society, implemented by The Council of Europe – 134,000 EUR;
- Conducting of the agricultural census in The Republic of Moldova, in partnership with SIDA and FAO – 500,000 EUR;
- Modernization of the local public services, in partnership with GTZ (German Technical Cooperation). Ensuring drinking water to the inhabitants of the Village Rosu, in Cahul district – 500,000 EUR;

Georgia: 300,000 EUR

- Implementation of the programme "Support protection and Promotion of Human Rights for Persons with Disabilities and Establishment of Enabling Environment for Provision of Better Services in Georgia" - UNDP Georgia – 300,000 EUR;

Serbia: 200,000 EUR

- Phase II of the project "Strengthening of Rural Capital Networks", unfolded by UNDP Serbia – 200,000 EUR.

II. Contributions to the benefit of the priority regions:

Eastern Europe: 600,000 EUR

- Contribution to the "Neighborhood Investment Facility": Financing infrastructure in the proximity region from Eastern Europe – 500,000 EUR;
- Co-finance, in cooperation with UNODC, of a legislation study in the domain of international penalty implementation among the countries of South-East Europe: *Strengthening the legal regime against terrorism* – 100,000 EUR;

The Black Sea: 50,051 EUR

- Organisation of the 2010 edition of the Black Sea NGO Forum. Collaboration of NGO's in the region in order to create and strengthen partnerships; held in Constanta during 22 and 23 November – 50,051 EUR.

III. Contributions to the benefit of other regions:

Lebanon: Palestinian Territories: 100,000 EUR

- Contribution to the UN Agency activity for Palestinian refugees (UNRWA) for the refugees from the Nahr el-Bared camp (Lebanon) – 100,000 EUR;

Haiti: 50,000 EUR

- Humanitarian aid, contribution to WFP, as a response to UN's Emergency call consequently to the earthquake in January 2010 – 50,000 EUR;

Pakistan: 100,000 EUR

- Humanitarian aid, contribution to the ICRC's Emergency call as a consequence of the Pakistan floods in 2010 – 100,000 EUR.

IV. Contributions to other projects:

- Course on Post-conflict Reconstruction, 2nd edition, implemented by the Romanian MFA in cooperation with UNDP Romania – 50,000 EUR.

V. Contributions to actions in the domain of development education and sensitization:

- Romania's participation to the European Days of Development (Brussels, 6-7 December 2010) The project was implemented through UNDP Romania – 10,545 EUR.

VI. Contributions to the benefit of multilateral organizations (with no specific geographical destination):

European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD): 100,000 EUR

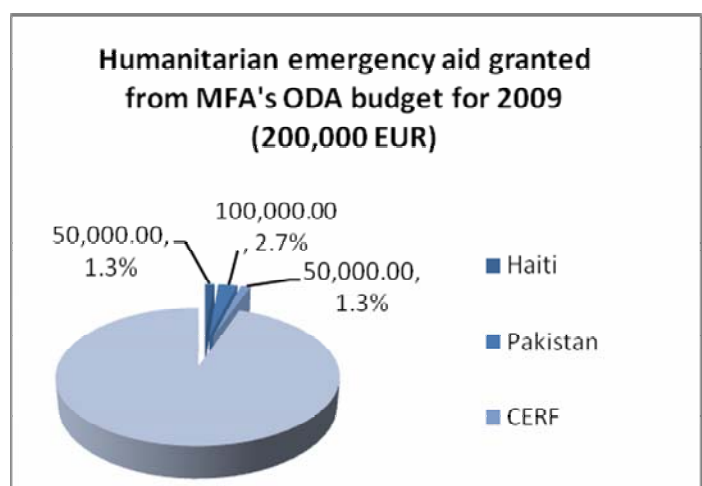
- Education For All Fund – 50,000 EUR;
- Fighting against the HIV/ AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria Fund – 50,000 EUR;

United Nations (UN): 170,000 EUR

- Contribution to the Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF/UNFCCC) – 100,000 EUR;
- Contribution to the UN Committee Special destination Fund for sustainability – 20,000 EUR;
- Contribution to the United Nations emergency fund (CERF) – 50,000 EUR.

Based on the above information, the humanitarian emergency aid granted from the MFA's ODA budget for 2010 amounted to 200,000 EUR, representing 5.3% of the total ODA budget. It was deducted as follows:

- **Haiti:** Humanitarian aid, contribution to WFP as a response to UN's Emergency call consequently to the earthquake in January 2010 – 50,000 EUR;



- **Pakistan:** Humanitarian aid, contribution to the ICRC's Emergency call as a consequence of the Pakistan floods in 2010 – 100,000 EUR;
- Contribution to the **United Nations emergency fund (CERF)** – 50,000 EUR.
